## Computer Scientist Finds a Cure for Her Son's Autism with Homeopathy

That includes doctors. What I have learned and experienced since I first discovered homeopathy in 1995 is incredible. If I can help others the way my family was helped, I will have accomplished my goal." Lansky has tried to make her book accessible and exciting for readers. It includes dozens of testimonials of homeopathic cures for a wide variety of physical, mental, and emotional conditions, including a chapter about her family's experiences. Described as "one of the most complete pictures of homeopathy ever written," *Impossible Cure* also includes an extensive science chapter that presents recent clinical trials of homeopathy, as well as discussion about how homeopathic remedies might work. *Impossible Cure* has won endorsements from some of the leading authorities in alternative medicine today, including: Larry Dossey, MD (known for his work on prayer and healing); Wayne Jonas, MD (former director of the Office of Alternative Medicine at NIH); Bernard Rimland, PhD (founder of the Autism Research Institute); and Michael Castleman (well-known author and columnist on alternative approaches to health care).
